1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries? San Clemente Rotary donated \$1625 (including the district grant of \$625) to the City of San Clemente for the purchase of trees to plant around the city. The city decides on the location. As a Tree City USA member, the city needs to have an Urban Forest Plan and accounting of trees in the city. The trees need to be planted in public areas where all can appreciate them. In the past they have been planted in parks and public schools, but this year, they decided to plant 50 trees at the San Clemente Municipal Golf Course. Most of these trees line a street along a fairway that is adjacent to a street with homes. These trees not only add to the beauty of the golf course but also protect the cars and homes from random golf balls.

A total of 50 trees were purchased for this event – all Ficus Nitida trees. This grant helped purchase these trees.

Rotarians, along with members of the San Clemente Garden Club, Citizen's Climate Education groups and City Council members and public citizens participated in the Arbor Day tree planting on April 26, 2025. The city and their landscape teams dug the holes where the trees were to be planted and assisted the groups in planting the trees. Twenty trees were planted along the street and the other 30 were planted in other areas of the golf course.

The public will benefit from this project including golfers, residents near the Municipal Golf Course, and citizens in general will benefit from the oxygen given off by these trees.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

Of the volunteer attendee list recorded, 33 total people were participating, of that number, 14 were Rotarians (see attendee sheets attached).

This umber does not include the city landscape workers or councilmembers.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Rotarians set up a table with information about the benefits of trees and the Urban Forest project along with Clean California Community designation information. A Rotarian member manned this table during the event and solicited participants to sign our attendance sheet. They also answered questions and maintained the documents available for pick up.

Other volunteers helped plant the trees – which included digging out the dirt of the pre-dug holes (backfilled prior for safety reasons), put fertilizer into the hole, helped put the trees into the holes, added root barriers to the hole, and filled the holes with new soil.

All twenty trees were planted prior to the rain spoiling the process, but it did not last long and after the rain the final trees were planted. See photos included in this report.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

The whole city will benefit from the project, so that is approximately 63,000 citizens. But San Clemente attracts many visitors so that number is minimal. Especially being at a golf course, many non-Rotarians will benefit as will the homeowners along the fairway.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Obvious benefits of an Urban Forest include oxygen and providing shade, but there are many other benefits: Providing habitats for birds, mammals and insects, filtering pollutants, regulating waterflow, improves physical and mental health, reducing the use of air conditioners, increases urban biodiversity, increases property values, and reduce ozone levels.

Not to mention, but they are beautiful!

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The Arbor Day event is a City of San Clemente event. They decided where the trees would be planted, when the event would take place, and did the heavy landscape work. The benefactors of the event (San Clemente Rotary, San Clemente Garden Club, and Citizen's Climate Education) donated the funds to purchase the trees and equipment used at the event.
