1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

The changes were approved by the club Board of Directors. The activities were at the Primo Tapia Elementary school in the Cantamar Baja area and also, at the Red Cross school of Nursing and First Responders in Tijuana. More than 430 students were benefited.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

Monarch Beach Sunrise attending members 5; Tijuana Rotary club members 4 and 6 members from the TJ Rotaract Club attended and directed activities for RYLA (A leadership educational program). We also had the participation of 10 Red Cross volunteers, teachers and directors.

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

- a) MBSR Rotary members helped at the school to install the projectors, screens and projector supports on the ceilings of the appropriate classrooms. The directors of the school were present. Also, a team of two MBSR members directed and participated with 15 school children to replant the ECO garden for the new season on Friday June 6th.
- b) On June 7th we attended and directed RYLA Rotary leadership program for 80 students (Nurses and First Responder students) for the event at the Red Cross building located in Tijuana.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

The school project will benefit 350 students from 6-13 years of age. The RYLA program benefited 80 young adult students (Nurses and First Responder students).

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

For the school children the ECO garden is a new experience for learning and understanding nature. For the RYLA young people that attended the program was an engaging experience and an education practice. Also, a better understanding of leadership in emergency cases by improving emergency responsive attitudes during emergency calls at the Red Cross
