Students from Sedona Red Rock JR High School, their parents, and the school are beneficiaries. Many students return saying it was life-changing and want to go again. Three gave testimonials to convince their classmates to attend - one went to JR RYLA last year, one attended JR & SR RYLA and now wants to be a JR counselor, the third was a senior who was a JR Counselor. The Superintendent & Principal of the school say that the changes in the students change the ethos of the school. - -

They work with the guidance counselor and JR Interact Faculty Advisor to recruit kids and parents. They run the Orientation Session attended by parents and students BEFORE they apply to JR RYLA.
