Rotary Club of Fullerton members will be invited and encouraged to participate at each phase of the project:

Day 1 (Prep & Demolition): 10-15 Rotary volunteers will assist with furniture removal and carpet tear-out to prepare the center for floor installation (8 hours).

Day 2 (Installation): If feasible, 3-6 Rotary volunteers will assist a professional installer with flooring (8 hours).

Day 3 (Reassembly): 10-15 Rotary volunteers will return furniture to its proper place (4 hours).

Rotary presence and participation will be visible, hands-on, and appreciated throughout.
